## SALT LAKE CITY TRIP - APRIL 1983 KANSAS COUNCIL OF GENEALOGICAL SOCIETIES

Are you ready to go with us to Salt Lake City? We will leave Topeka at 6:30 PM on Friday, April 22, 1983 arriving in Salt Lake City late Saturday night. We will leave Salt Lake City on Saturday, April 30 about 2:00 PM arriving back in Topeka about 4:00 PM on May 1st. We will go out Interstate 70 and will pick up passengers along that route.

We will board the bus at the Ramada Inn downtown Topeka off 4th Street exit. Cars may be parked at the Civic Center parking garage at 723 Quincy. Someone will shuttle you back to the Ramada from the garage. Price for parking per day at the garage is \$2.00 or \$18 for the 9 days.

There is room for 45 people on our Winfield bus. We drive straight through with stops for meals and snacks. There is a restroom on the bus. NO SMOKING ON THE BUS!

We already have lots of names on our list, so if you want to go, send in your \$50 deposit NOW. Full price must be paid by March 1, 1983. If your deposit arrives after the bus is full, your name will be placed on a waiting list and your deposit returned until there is an opening. If your deposit isn't returned within two weeks from the date you send it, consider yourself on the bus. Send a SASE if you want an answer.

Future information will be mailed to you as soon as your deposit is returned and all plans are complete. If you find that you cannot go after having sent full payment, your deposit will be returned when someone else has filled your place. This should not be a problem as we have lots of names on the list.

We will be staying at the TEMPLE SQUARE HOTEL which is just three blocks from the library. The hotel has provided us with a meeting room to use for our Sunday and Monday evening get-to-gethers. These short meetings help us to become better acquainted. We will all be wearing name tags. Instructions on how to use the library are provided for first timers at these get-to-gethers.

You may take as much luggage as you desire, however, only two pieces are covered in the price of the trip. Extra pieces are \$1.50 each. Luggage tags will be provided.

#### A NEW VIEWPOINT FOR KESEARCH

"All of the genealogy books are not in the genealogy collection", commented Jayne PURCELL. To prove her point, she went to the art and sculpture section of the Hutchinson Public Library and pulled out a book entitled Gravestones of Early New England and the Men Who Made Them 1652 - 1800 by Harriette MERRIFIELD FORBES, New York: Do Capo Press, 1967 (731.549, Forbes, 67). Sure enough, Jayne was right; the book had information of interest to genealogists.

While the theme of this book may seem grim, the subject matter is not depressing and does enlarge the reader's knowledge of early New England. For example funerals, on which large sums were often spent, gave a diversion from monotonous living conditions for whole communities. In turn, the rock gravestones, which often were artistically carved by local craftsmen, were meant to honor the dead and to teach the living.

Each of these carved stones held a meaning for the passer-by, many of whom could not read the inscriptions. However, each person knew the meaning of a death's head, a coffin, a spade, the grim reaper or an angel.

In <u>Gravestones</u>, the reader will find practical knowledge on the kinds of gravestones, the artistic decoration, and the artisans who carved the stones. Also, he will find a list of the names and dates for the various gravestone artists in an appendix.

If a reader is interested in researching early New England from a different view-point, Jayne may have found a good book for him to read.

#### DO YOU REMEMBER?

That wonderful odor as you go down Main Street! That's Hamburger Gene in his wagon on the southwest corner of First and Main. While you wait, he flattens his hamburger patties and puts them on the hot grill. When that salt and pepper hits the hot grill, that delicious odor floats all over Main Street. He slices a big juicy onion, reaches into the barrel for a big dill pickle and slices it, puts these on a hot bun and in less than 10 minutes you walk away with your hamburger. Delicious!

Saturday night was the big night of the week. All the stores were open until 9. Everyone came to town to shop. Workers who were busy all week got their pay checks on Saturday and came to town to buy a weeks supply of food, clothes and necessities. A good time to meet all your friends and neighbors.

Sunday afternoon occupations: Parking on Main Street watching the window shoppers walking up and down the street. Even getting out for a stroll yourself.

Got a date? Want to take the family out for a treat? Go to the Midland Theatre where Joyce KRICK or 'Cubby' BAER played the organ during the show. Shades of Pearl WHITE Serial and Wallace REID, handsome hero. After the show, go across the street to the Chocolate Shoppe for ice cream sodas, thick creamy malts and hot chocolate fudge sundaes.

In hot weather, about 9 PM we would pile into Dad's 7 passenger Buick. It had 2 folding seats and we thought that was great. We would drive down the street to the next block and pick up Dad's secretary and her mother and go for a ride to cool off. We hit all the small towns around Hutchinson. (It was cooler in the country). We would come home about 11 o'clock. If it was still hot, we'd get our comforters and sleep in the yard.

There was a small building across the street on 13th east from what is now Coberly's Drug Store. It was POHLER and WICKENDAL'S, who made the most delicious ice-cream. Flavors you never hear of today. On summer evenings there was a steady stream of customers.

Behind the Hutchinson News building on East 2nd Street, south of the old Santa Fe

Depot, was a small stone building, the Busy Bee. It was run by Gus SHUMAS who sold hamburgers, sandwiches, soup, meals, pie, coffee, etc. Before every passenger train arrived, he sent someone wearing a sign and ringing a bell to let passengers know they could find quick meals and sandwiches. In early days no food was served on the trains. He also fed the workers from the News and other businesses around.

We used to have two telegraph companies in town. Western Union and Postal Telegraph. They had a crew of young fellows in uniform who delivered messages over town on their bicycles.

These are some things remembered from the 1920's by Alta (ENGLER) PROCTOR.
