Donations and gifts to the society are tax deductible.


Meetings are held on the third Monday of each month (except December) in the auditorium of the Hutchinson Public Library, 9th and Main, 7:00 - 9:00 PM.

A BOOK REVIEW: NEWSPAPERS ON MICROFILM

Becky HATTON, the guardian angel of RCGS has compiled a book to aid family researchers. The soft cover book is entitled A Directory of Local Newspapers on Microfilm Held by All the Libraries in the South Central Kansas Library System Area. The microfilms are listed for twelve nearby counties plus Marion County. Since these newspapers were published from shortly after the counties were established until the present, they are valuable tools for the ancestor searcher.

With her usual thorough workmanship, Becky has listed the titles of newspapers with location codes, titles by city, and titles by county. Hence a person has several ways of finding the newspaper he wants. In addition, she has listed the various location codes with the names and addresses of libraries in each area.

Hopefully the reader's interest is aroused at this point. The book may be ordered from the Reno County Genealogical Society, P.O. Box 5, Hutchinson, KS 67504-0005, or you may pick one up at the library. The price is \$2.00 plus 35¢ for postage.

KIOWA AND COMMANCHE INDIAN RESERVATIONS OPENED FOR SETTLEMENT - 1901

Submitted for publication by Alta PROC-TOR; written by her father, Edward ENGLER.

In 1901 the Kiowa and Commanche Indian Reservations in south and western Oklahoma were opened for settlement to white settlers. There were 8,000 claims in the El Reno and Lawton districts. 14,000 registered in the Lawton district and 15,000 in the El Reno district.

I sold my barbershop in Billings, Oklahoma. A friend and I bought a large tent and 30 army cots, planning to rent them out for sleeping quarters. We sent these on ahead to El Reno. The tent got there, but the cots never did show up.

The railroads sent several trains a day. They were long passenger cars and freight cars, packed so full that if you wanted to get out, you had to be helped in and out of the windows. People rode on top, on the sides, on the rods, and wherever they could find a hand-hold. This went on every day for six weeks. Every nook and cranny of the cars were full. People came in wagons, buggies, horseback and on foot.

We got to El Reno about midnight. There were no rooms to rent--everything was full. Vacant lots, tents, yards with grass, railroad platforms, sidewalks, even piles of railroad ties. Streets were crowded night and day with men, women and children. They walked around and around until they were so tired they would drop in their tracks and sleep awhile.

Then there were the theives and robbers all over town. They robbed people of their money and return railroad tickets. People went hungry because they had lost their money. Gambling machines were everywhere; on vacant lots, streets, sidewalks, rooms, even on the flat top roofs of store buildings.

There was a double line three blocks long waiting to get into the post office, and also the registration office. Many people would stand in line until they got near the window, then sell their place to someone else. I personally saw one man sell his place in line for \$25.00.

There was vice of all kinds--shootings,

robberies, looting. Police and soldiers had a terrible time trying to police the place.

We set up our tent when we got there, but since the cots didn't arrive, we just invited our friends in to sleep on the ground. We did not make any money, but had lots of fun.

One friend almost had his horses stolen from in front of our tent. He claimed to be a light sleeper and as he and a friend slept under the wagon he thought everything was safe. One night I heard a noise outside. I went to the door and looked out just as two men were starting to untie the horses. I grabbed my gun and fired a shot. They turned the horses loose and ran. My friend could no longer claim to be a light sleeper.

My brother and I got in the registration line at 3 A.M. every morning and stayed until 8 P.M. It took us six days to reach the registration office. My number was 13,753. Neither of us won a claim nor did any of our friends.

STAFFORD COUNTY'S NEOLA CEMETERY

When a new board was elected for Stafford County's Neola Cemetery in 1981, the lack of clear records was discovered. Two very old ledgers listed the lot owners, a dim map on a piece of plywood, and a worn old cloth map with some X's on it was the extent of the information available.

I was contacted to draw a new map. As I researched the available information, I came to the conclusion it was inadequate and in a haphazard form.

The cemetery is located in the NW corner of Section 36, Township 25S, range 11W, Stafford County, Kansas. Because of the location in the southeastern most section of the county, the research also reached into Reno and Pratt Counties.

In 1879, a sod church and school house was built on the site. The cemetery was started in October 1879 when little Franklin HATHAWAY died from a rattlesnake bite.

Research began with the old ledgers. New maps were drawn with the placement of the lots and the owners clearly marked. An alphabetical listing of lot owners was indicated. Following each lot owner, a location symbol for the lot was devised such as: BLACK, Wm. B III L 18 (meaning block III, Lot 18).

A canvass of the tombstones was the next step. Several friends were asked to assist and we each chose one section. The need for placement of the graves on the lots was indicated. For such a chart I used lower case letters beginning with 'a' as the north grave site and next 'b', 'c', 'd' and 'e'. The old maps indicated graves with X's. After the canvass, there were sixty-six unnamed and unmarked graves indicated. Families were contacted in an effort to identify these unnamed graves.

The final compilation is a fifty-seven page brochure with maps for each section, as well as a listing of lot owners and a grave registry by placement. A complete alphabetized grave registry is included.

So much material has surfaced from the research that a compilation of area family histories is indicated and may be attemped in the future.

GIFTS TO LIBRARY AND THE RENO COUNTY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

ROBISON FAMILY HISTORY, compiled and edited by Mrs. Barbara ROBISON DUDLEY of 1019-37th N.E., Seattle, WA, has been presented to the library and the society by the editor of the book.

In 1884 or 1885 William Leonard ROBISON, his wife Rebecca Jane and their two daughters and three sons moved from Pennsylvania to Hill City, Kansas. Another son was born after their arrival in Kansas.

The sons became professional men: John Hatton practiced dentistry at Great Bend, Kansas; Homer Blackburn first practiced dentistry at Ellinwood, later orthodontia at Ellinwood, Great Bend and Hutchinson; Norval William practiced medicine at Bison, Kansas and Corbin Edward practiced law at Fort Morgan, Colorado.

WHO WAS C.W. PECKHAM?

C.W. PECKHAM was a pioneer who settled in Haven Township in the spring of 1871. He recalled in 1922 that in that spring, 51 years before, his house was the furthermost west on the south side of the Arkansas River.

A virgin prairie, this land that PECKHAM marked with his humble shack, sod house or dug-out; but he wasn't alone for very long for into this area there soon came a steady stream of settlers. Hardy men and women blessed with far-sighted dreams and determination. The experiences of one such pioneer, John U. SCHOONOVER are related in a STORY BY PECKHAM in a special issue of The Hutchinson News on 4 July, 1922.

But who was C.W. PECKHAM? We can now add the label 'writer' to the list of discriptive words. He was a fruit-grower too. At the 10th annual fair for Hutchinson in September of 1883, C.W. PECKHAM is listed with W.R. PENNINGTON and others as having "excellent displays of fruit". In twelve short years after his arrival, our pioneer had coaxed trees to bear fruit on the barren Kansas prairie.

In April 1886, as part of the Haven Town Company, PECKHAM witnessed the birth of Haven, Kansas.

This then was C.W. PECKHAM. Son, brother, nephew, husband, father, pioneer, farmer, fruit producer, writer, town founder, and...poet. A poet who left a home-spun description of pioneer life in our region that paints a picture in five short verses as graphic as any history book. Consider the following:

But it was not all starvation For, sometimes we'd have a feast When we'd get a great big box, From our friends, who lived "down east".

Then, we'd invite in all the neighbors, And we sure would have some eats. And, we'd pull that jug of cider, 'Til we'se just as red as beets.

Then, we'd clear off all the dishes, And, we'd set away the chairs, And, we'd carry out the table, And we'd stand around in pairs.

Then we'd take that squeaky fiddle From its place upon the wall, And we'd have the swellest party, Ya ever seen, in all yer life.

The poem is signed with pride: C.W. PECKHAM, and in words beginning with capital letters, The Pioneer.




A NOTE FROM PAT MITCHELL

Pat MITCHELL'S story on the previous page motivated your editor to do a little additional research on the question of "Who was C.W. PECKHAM?"

Charles W. PECKHAM was born in 1849 in Ohio. Both his parents were born in New York State. He came to Kansas from Texas. In 1875 he farmed 160 acres. In 1895 he had 560 acres valued at \$12,000. By 1905 his land was valued at \$25,000.

He raised apples, pears, peaches, cherries and blackberries as well as wheat, corn, oats, irish potatoes, alfalfa and hay.

Charles W. PECKHAM, age 24, and Sarah C. HAYS, age 22, were married 12 June 1874 at the home of David HAYS by Elder G.E. PAL-MER. To this union were born 10 children:
