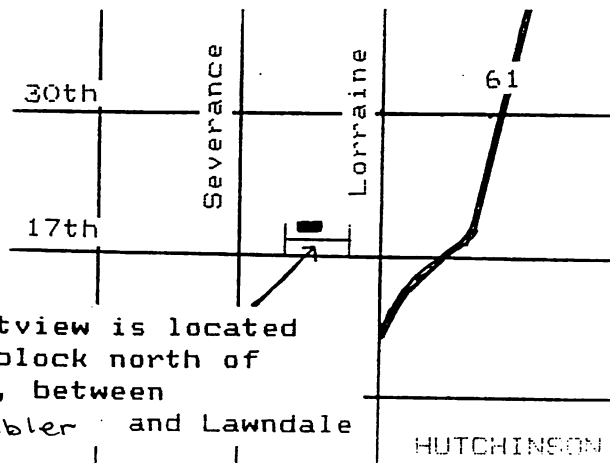

THE GENEALOGICAL HELPER--Query Section. Karen Burgess inserted six queries in the July-Aug 1993 issue. She received several replies. One response indicated a Revolutionary War Veteran. With this information she consulted the "Genealogical Abstracts of Revolutionary War Pension Files" Volumes I, II, & III and the Index (Vol. IV) which is an every name index. She has added eight ancestors to the Burgess Family Tree from all of her sources. (Karen gave a demonstration of how she used the books at the July RCGS meeting)

THE SUNFLOWER--Ancestor Chart. Barbara Murphy's ancestor chart was printed in the May 1993 issue of "The Sunflower". Two days later, she received a call from a woman in California, who gave her the name and address of a man to contact in North Dakota for information about one of her norwegian line. There is a delay, the man is in Norway at the present time. Barbara's cousin is also in Norway with a tour group and the tour guide has helped her make arrangements to visit the Parish Church and look at the old records. Needless to say Barbara sent along an ancestor chart and many family group records in hopes that she will get a lot of additional information.

VALDRES SAMBAND STEVNE--I attended the Valdres Samband Stevne June 17-19 at the North Dakota State College of Science in Wahpeton, North Dakota..

This meeting was attended by descendants of emigrants from the Valdres Valley in Oppland county Norway. I was informed that in all probability I was related to most of them in some way.

The first day was devoted entirely to genealogical research. There were many farm books, microfilm of church records, maps, and family and farm histories. I used the copy machine a lot, because I cannot get some of the farm history books through inter-library loan. There were two men from the Valdres area to assist the bygdlag genealogist and they were very helpful when I had questions about translating the material I copied.

The second and third day there were language lessons, folk dance lessons, slides of the Valdres Valley and Valdres history lessons. It was so

tempting to stay in the genealogy room and work,, but I did attend some of the other events.. Each evening there was entertainment in the College Auditorium presented by local individuals and groups.

What did I learn? My Norwegian ancestry on one line has been traced back into Scotland to the MacLeod clan. Actually, I haven't had time to count the number of generations that would be, but I do have a large chart that will show me the ancestry. It is now on 6 pages to be pieced together before I can study it--I've had too much company during June and July to work on it. I have a map that shows the outlines of the different farms where my ancestors lived. I went through many family histories to get translations of the probate records that helped trace many collateral lines and gave me descriptions of the farms.

Do I want to go to the meeting next year in Granite Falls, MN next year? Oh, YES!!! Does Ed want to go? NO. Maybe I can get one of my Norwegian cousins to go with me.

I would recommend that **YOU** join an ethnic genealogical society, especially one centered around the area your ancestors emigrated from.

CEMETERY ACCIDENT

This newspaper article was found among the papers of Gladys Smith Childs, the mother of Denver Childs. Her grandmother was Margaret Meacham, probably a granddaughter of this James Meacham. No date is given—some records indicate it was 1890.

TUESDAY—There seems to be considerable misunderstanding concerning an accident at the funeral of the late James Meacham today at Mt. Zion. (Jackson County, Ohio) We were present and near the hearse at the time being a pall-bearer. The facts are these: The pall bearers were getting ready to remove the coffin from the hearse, when it was discovered that the relatives of the deceased had not yet left their carriages with the exception of Mr. and Mrs. George Meacham. The pall-bearers stepped back to wait until Mr. Marshman, the undertaker got the mourners from the carriages. That gentleman took a buggy and moved it around one of Mr. Smith's team. That team moved a pace or two and touched a stick or piece of rail which made some noise, frightening them, and they dashed away with the carriage. Mr. King, who had charge of the hearse team, left his seat and came back to assist in getting the coffin out, and the team, startled by the other running team, sprang forward up the hill. They could easily have been stopped, but everybody seemed paralyzed by the horror of the situation, and they galloped up the road, some half to three fourths of a mile, past the old home of the deceased. The horses kept to the road and no damage was done save the breaking of a hearse spring and some glass in the hearse. The body was in no wise disarranged, nor was the coffin moved. A young man named Arthur took after the team on horseback and caught it. The horses were walking when he came to them. There was no blame attached, unless it be to the man having charge of the hearse team, as the horses should not have been left alone, after being in the stable for some time. Mr. King doubtless thought everything safe. But there is one thing that ought to be looked after. At a time of a funeral, where there must necessarily be a number of teams, horses should be carefully looked after. Vicious or over-playful horses should be kept away from such places as much as possible. Such an accident will probably never occur again in this community.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN

DIRECT LINEAGE--Direct ancestors on your ancestor chart, i.e. your parents, grandparents, great-grandparents, for as many generations as you can find.

COLLATERAL LINEAGE--Relatives on your family group sheets and their ancestors, i.e. your father or mother's brothers and sisters, your brother or sister and their families.

CONSORT--On a tombstone would indicate that the person's spouse is still alive.

RELICT--On a tombstone would indicate that the person was a widow or widower.

CEMTAPH--If engraved on a tombstone, indicates an empty grave. The stone was erected in memory of someone who was buried elsewhere.

ORPHAN--Someone under the age of 21 who had lost his or her father, the mother may still be living.

JUNIOR--Could mean "son of", or could indicate a younger man of the same name in the same area. The same person could become "senior" at a later period of time.

AHNENTAFEL--German: "ancestor table" uses a numbering system identical to that of a pedigree chart: No. 1 - first generation; No. 2 - father of No. 1; No. 3 - mother of No. 1; No. 4 - father of No. 2; No. 5 - mother of No. 2; No. 6 - father of No. 3; No. 7 - mother of No. 3. (Double the child's number to determine the father's number, and add one to that number to determine the mother's number.)

NEW RCGS PUBLICATION

RECORDED EARLY BIRTHS OF RENO COUNTY, KANSAS 1890-1911 published by the Reno County Genealogical Society. This book was copied and compiled by members of the RCGS, and typed by Delma Ashcraft.

The introduction reads: We are pleased to offer the Recorded Early Births of Reno County, Kansas covering the years 1890-1911. It is our way of helping those researching in Reno county. These records were abstracted from microfilm located in the Hutchinson Public Library. Some of the handwriting was hard to read. The typist used the Marriage

Book of Reno County plus other sources to help decipher the names which were difficult to read. In doing research we have found there were many births that were not recorded.

The book is divided into three sections. Book I, 1890-1893; Book II, 1894-1900; Book III, 1901 to July 1911, when recording of births were begun on the state level.

The book "COMPUTERIZED LIST OF PERSONS BURIED AT MEMORIAL PARK CEMETERY" compiled by Kimberlie K. Hardy and Jill Jacobs was presented to the Reno County Genealogical Society by the MEMORIAL PARK CEMETERY, 5905 West Fourth, PO BOX 462, HUTCHINSON KS 67504-0462.

The book lists all of the persons buried in Memorial Park Cemetery from 1925 to May 25, 1993. Besides the name of the person, the date of burial is given and the location of the burial plot. A map of the cemetery was included with the book.

Thanks to Kimberlie K. Hardy, Jill Jacobs, the Memorial Park Cemetery and to Darrell Corkins, who suggested that the RCGS receive this very valuable research tool.

CONFEDERATE NAVY

If your ancestor served in the Confederate Navy, the FHL is in possession of a rare pamphlet published in 1863 entitled Register of the Commissioned and Warrant Officers of the Navy of the Confederate States to Jan. 1, 1863. The call number is FHL #975 M3r or Microfilm #1035530, Item 8. The pamphlet lists names and home states for those enumerated. It is interesting to note that there were individuals from many of the then Northern states included in this roster.

CONFEDERATE PENSIONS

The FHL has microfilmed pension records for most Confederate states. Naturally the United States Government would not grant pensions to those fighting against the Union, but the individual states of the former Confederacy recognized their obligation to provide for those who fought for the Rebel Cause. Pensions were granted to those veterans of the Confederacy or their dependents who resided in one of those states after the war. The remaining files are in the archives of the state which granted the pensions.

NEW "PHONE" DATABASE AT HPL

The Reference Department has installed "Phone Disc", a CD-ROM national phone directory which includes both residential and business listings. Searches can be narrowed by city, state or in the case of businesses, by type of business activity.

It has been installed on a trial or preview basis. IF it is purchased by the library it would be a very useful research tool. Financing the software is the problem. ANY SUGGESTIONS?

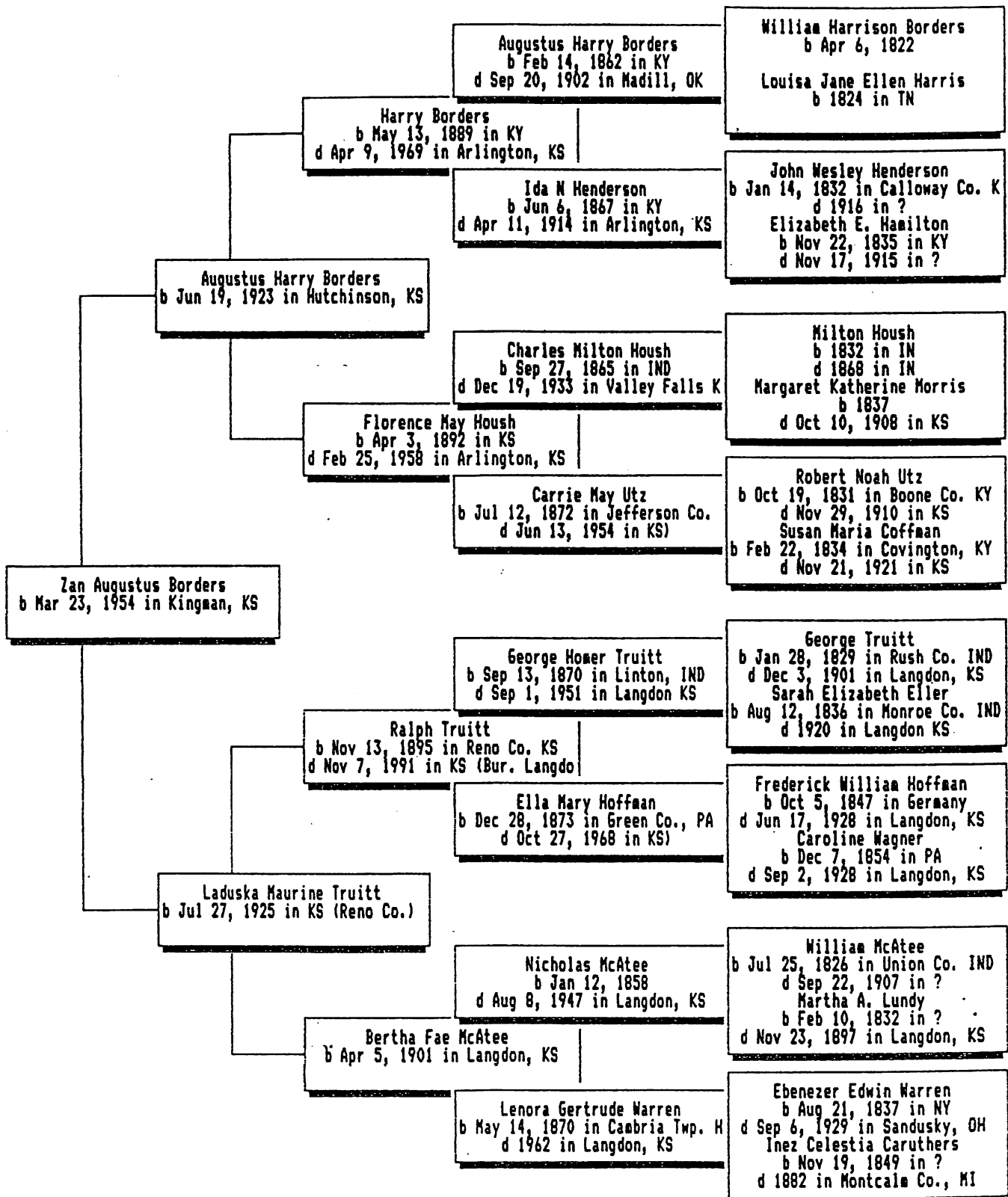

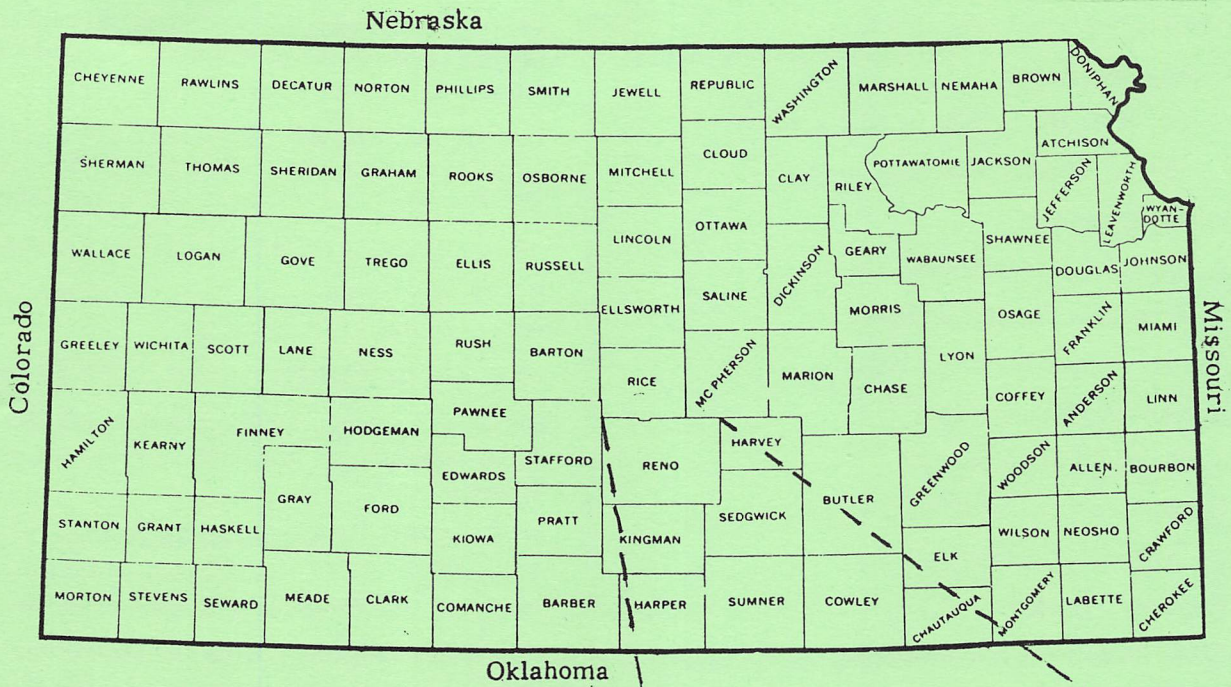

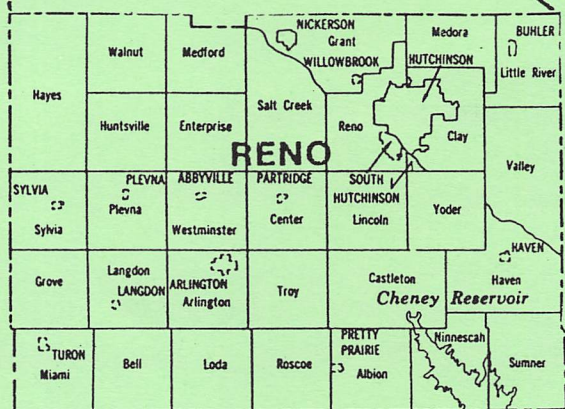
