RESOURCE INFORMATION

AMA DECEASED PHYSICIAN FILE

The National Genealogical Society now offers a research service for entries in the AMA Deceased Physician File.

The file is incomplete from 1878 to 1905, but comprehensive from 1906 to 1969.

Information in the database usually includes date and place of birth and death, medical school attended, place of practice, hospital affiliation, and obituary.

Surnames "A" through "L" now available.

Include: First and Last Name of Physician, Time Period, and Location (if known).

Research Fee: \$15.00 per name. (Prepayment required)

NATIONAL GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY MEMBER ANCESTOR CHART INDEXING PROJECT

Volunteers are indexing the 66,000 Member Ancestor Charts (MAC) of the National Genealogical Society

By the first week in September 1997, they had reached the letter "G" (the sixth file cabinet drawer out of 17).

After a database has been established, it will be used to create several indexes that will be sent to the Family History Library for filming. The filmed versions of the index will accompany the filmed versions of the MACs, both of which will be viewable at LDS family history centers.

- * A surname list of parents, spouses, children and others.
- * An index of married women by married surname, cross-referenced to the maiden surname.
- * A separate Compiler (NGS member who submitted the MAC) index will round out the indexes so that all MACs submitted by one family member can be located thoughout the collection.

No completion date was given in the article, but it could be several years.

OKLAHOMA 1890 CENSUS

Many genealogists know that most of the 1890 census records were destroyed by a fire in 1921. There is, however, an 1890 Oklahoma Territorial Census available which was not destroyed in the fire. This pre-statehood census should be very helpful.

QUESTIONS, QUESTIONS:

It is very important that we periodically review and evaluate our research notes. This will help determine what documentation is needed and hidden clues may be uncovered. The following questions should be answered as you review the Family Group sheets:

- 1. Are all dates for all events in proper order?
- 2. Are all abbreviations correct?
- 3. Is every fact documented?
- 4. Have you found your ancestor in every census of his/her life?
- 5. Have you looked for citizenship or naturalization papers?
- 6. Was the father married more than once?
- 7. Do all the children belong to one wife?
- 8. Is a pattern evident in the chilldren's names?
- 9. Did the father serve in the military? If yes, what war?
- 10. Did the family own land?
- 11. Have you found the father's will and probate records?
- 12. Have you researched tax lists & church records?
- 13. Figuring the dates, how many children could the mother have had?
- 14. Do all her children belong to one husband?
- 15. If widowed, did she live with her children in later years?
- 16. Do you have the children listed in correct birth order?
- 17. Do you have place of birth and marriage information for each child?
- 18. Have you followed each child in the census to see if a parent or grandparent is living with them?
- 19. Have you checked to see if a book was ever written about your family?
- 20. Have you checked to see if your families are in the Family History Center's IGI?
- 21. Have you entered your family names in Ancestral File?
- 22. Have you considered that your ancestor may have kept a diary?
- 23. Have you plotted your family's immigration path?
- 24. Have you placed queries on your families in all the genealogical periodicals?

Review documents acquired over time. New clues will surface that were missed the first time, or the information didn't fit with your data at that time. Pioneer Branches, Vol. IX, No. 1, Oct 1993.

Effective 1 July 1997 Iowa vital statistics records were transferred from the Department of Health in Des Moines, to the local county Recorders. The fee for certified copies of vital records remains \$10.

WEST SALEM UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

Members of the West Salem United Methodist Church, that were attending, at the close of the church in 1967, the church they joined and a later address (time period not available).

SALEM UNITED BRETHREN CHURCH

The first Salem United Brethren Church was built in 1895 and dedicated by Bishop Castle. It burned in 1910 and was rebuilt. The new church, pictured on page 35, was dedicated on the first Sunday in June, 1912, by Bishop William Weekly. One of the first ministers to serve the church was Rev. D. H. Sill.

Some of the early members were Lewis, and Ethel Dietz, Klingmans, Harveys, Schmuckers, Corleys, Zimmermans, Leslies, Christmans, Webbs, Averys, Elliotts, Wisbys, Oyers, Somers.

In 1947, the Salem Church became a part of the Evangelical United Brethren Church. On May 11, 1967, the church members voted to discontinue services July first. Danny Held was the Minister. Some members went to the Huntsville Church, The Triumph Church and the Alden Church.

WEST SALEM HISTORY 1895-1967

The original Hodge Schoolhouse was located two and one half miles east from the present Salem U. B. Church. In the early 80's the Mennonites just south and east did some missionary work there, after which W. L. Hinshaw, whose home was south of Sterling, followed them for a time.

Rev. Baker preached at the Walnut Grove Schoolhouse two miles south and one half mile east of the present Salem U. B. Church.

After that W. L. Hinshaw preached at the Center School which was located in the center of section eight, which section comes north and west of our present church. A church organization was effected 1880's to 1895.

For over ten years services were held in school houses. In the early ninety's the need was realized for a church building and a board of trustees was elected composed of the following men. G. L. Hammel, Peter Miller, John Siler, Jacob Royer.

Charles Klingman hauled the first lumber from Plevna. There was some delay in carrying out plans and the office of John Siler was vacated after his move from the community. R. M. Harvey was elected to fill the vacancy. It was through the advice of W. L. Hinshaw and Rev. Osborn that better

lumber was purchased at an extra cost of one hundred dollars. So the church was built and dedicated by Bishop Castle.

The Ladies Aid was organized in 1897 with Mrs. Kate Miller as president. Mrs. Geo. Avery was church musician. Hastin secured money for the purchase of an organ. Mrs. Avery was sent to Hutchinson to buy one, but unable to find a good organ, ordered it from Kansas City instead. The organ was sent to Sterling and Mrs. Avery hauled the organ to the church with Avery's delivery wagon.

The Christian Endeavour Society was organized in 1900, with Geo. Avery, as president. Edith Avery, who is now Mrs. Olmstead, was the second president.

Salem was on the circuit, which included the church in Sterling and several others.

The pastors from 1895 to 1902 were A. S. Bacon, ? Thomas, G. W. Tuttle, H. H. Zeigler and E. R. Meyers.

In 1902 Salem and the Liberty Church, northwest of Sterling formed the Sterling Circuit. The church in Sterling being known as the Sterling Station.

The pastors from 1902 to 1911 were: G. W. Morgan, 1902-1905; J. N. Edwards, 1905-1906; C. E. Murphy, 1906-1907; J. R. Harner, 1907-1910; W. D. Cunningham, 1910; A. L. Powell, 1910-1911.

PASTORS AT WEST SALEM CHURCH 1895-1902

J. Covington. 1916-1917; R. H. Sill, 1917-1920; W. J. Hinshaw, 1920-1921; Paul Blinn, 1922-May 4; G.S.Hanleiter, 1922-1923; James Buckles, 1923-1924; S. S. Cunningman, 1924-1925; Byron W. Travis, 1925-

1926; J. W. Reeves, 1926-1930; Harold Vivian, 1930-1931; V. R. Kellams, 1931-1932; Clyde Koontz, 1932-1935; Harry Simms, 1935-1939; Kenneth Barker, 1939-1943; Mrs. Shepple, 1943-1944.

Additional names include: William Baldwin, Lantz, Julian, Rev. Perkins (1951), Fooche, Richard Bucks, Jack Eddy, Jim Sweney, Harry Connesly, Jon Sward, Danny Deld—to serve till the first of July of 1967.

The parsonage was sold to Dylce Dietz for \$1,653.00 July, 1959.

The first church was burned in 1910. There was insurance on the property. After a delay of more than a year, the new church was built at a cost of \$4640.00 and a parsonage worth \$900.00 was also built.

Quoting from T. W. Parks Superintendents report of the conference minutes of 1911, "The Sterling Circuit after a distressing lapse of two months, was supplied. A. F. Powell being secured. This brother has labored under great difficulites. A few weeks after he took charge of the work, the Salem Church was consumed by fire, leaving him without a church building, and not any too loyal of a people."

The new church was dedicated the first Sunday in June 1912 by Bishop Wm. Weekly. The following were members of the Board of Trustees: Rev. J. Corley, Chairman; Charles Klingman, Treasurer; Walter Harvey; Davy Klingman; Mark Elliott, Sr.; R. M. Harvey; G. K. Siler; F. R. Somers and Ed Oyer.

At the conference of 1911, held at Arkansas City, Salem was made a Station and has remained as one since that time.

With the advice of C. V. Priddle and under the pastorate of J. W. Reeves, a basement was placed under the Salem Church at a cost of \$1800.00 and a reopening was held in June 1929.

The following served on the Board of Trustees: L. W. Deitz; Frank Leslie; Walter Harvey; Walter Ragland and Geo. Mosier. The depression came on and the \$800.00 debt left by this project was carried along. In the fall of 1934, \$100 was paid and on January 19th, 1936 an all day service was held and the mortgage was burned. Superintendent Priddle and Pastor Clyde Koontz took part in this service.

The Board of Trustees at the time the mortgage was paid off were: Walter Harvey; Walter Ragland; Roy Schmucker; Orvie Harvey and Frank D. Webb.

An old pioneer of the Early Salem Church was Rev. Corley, who served as S. S. Supt., class leader, trustee, filled the pulpit, preached funerals, performed marriage ceremonies, and was presiding elder of the conference. Geo. and Casper Avery who attend Salem Church were active as boys in the Methodist Church.

It was decided on May 11, 1967 to try and transfer to some other church. It was agreed that Danny Held would hold services till the first of July. West Salem United Methodist Church joined the Huntsville United Methodist Church. (Does anyone know the date this happened?)

NICKERSON UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

The Nickerson United Methodist Church was organized in April 1875. Records of Sunday School teachers are available from the year 1896. Records also show that Sunday School attendance sometimes numbered more than 300 with the greatest number present 354.

Written records of each Sunday's happenings show the teachers present, the "fill-in" teachers, the number of students present and the amount of offering taken, sometimes the weather for the day was recorded.

(Interesting note: Many women and men were listed with only Miss, Mrs. or Mr. We haven't been able to determine for certain what the given name would have been. If you can help identify the first names of the persons, please contact Mrs. Margaret Childs.)


WEST SALEM CLOSES ITS DOORS


Taken from the Bulletin, that was published Thursday, June 29, 1967.

The Called Name

Be aware of nicknames and the use of interchangeable names. Although legal documents today will always contain a person's official name, in times past a person's called name was just as likely to be used. Within the same document, for example, you might find a person alternately referred to as Sarah and as Sally. It is always a good idea to keep handy a reference list of male and female nicknames. Most of the nicknames for given names are familiar to us today, but some such as the interchangeable usage of the names Ann and Nancy are not.

The Suffix

Don't fall into the Jr/Sr trap. Junior meant "younger" not "son of" and Senior meant "elder" not "father of." Today if a person is named at birth with a suffix such as Jr. he remains a Jr all his life. In times past, these suffixes were used more to differentiate a person as he was related age-wise to another person of the same name who was involved in a particular event (e.g., muster roll, tax list, etc.) and had absolutely no bearing on any family relationship. Jr. and Sr. were even used on occasion to distinguish between wto females with the same name. Suffixes for a particular individual can flip-flop. A person recorded as a Jr. at one point in time could be recorded as a Sr. who has died later "appearing" to be alive because a previous Jr. had then become a Sr.

The Indices

The chance of having a different name spelling is compounded when documents are indexed. Put yourself in the position of the poor indexer who sits there all day looking at a bunch of names which are unfamiliar. Oh how much easier it is to identify a name in a scribbling if you know what the name should be. I try not to be too harsh on the indexer, but it is so irritating to see obvious errors, particularly in a census index, that could have been spotted by a simple edit scan (e.g., Smtih or Jnoes or Brwon). When using an index, refer to your spelling/misspelling list. Also compile a list of the various combinstions of first names, middle names, and called names. A man named James William Smith could very well be indexed in a number of different ways—J. W. Smith, James (or Jim or Jimmy) Smith, J. William Smith and William Smith.
